Latin Explorers Camp

What language and cultural content can my child expect to experience during *Latin Explorers Camp*?

Overarching theme **Feliz Navidad**

In this program, students develop language related to the overarching topic of 'Feliz Navidad' (Merry Christmas) as well as everyday group session routines such as greetings, meeting their peers and exchanging 'getting to know you' information in the target language.

Some key language elements your child will be exposed to during this program include:

- Greetings and introductions (eg. age, personality, birthday, interests, school subjects)
- Christmas related vocabulary
- Adjectives and verbs related to theme
- Colours
- Numbers
- Emotions
- The weather

As the sessions are interactive, Latin Explorers will learn to ask questions and exchange information in a fun and immersive context. While language content is introduced / consolidated, this will lead to a natural exposure to grammatical concepts such as:

- verbs: (eg. ser, tener, estar, poder, gustar, comer, beber, vivir, cantar, ver, regalar, querer, ir)
– conjugations across different tenses including present, past, future, progressive and conditional (adapted complexity to suit language level of children)
- Using puede + verb
- Using me gustaria + verb
- Syntactic order (noun + adjective)
- Gender (masculine / feminine)
- Prepositions of location
- Responding to verbs in the imperative form (instructions)
- Question words

Throughout the LinguaKidz Spanish Language programs, developing an appreciation of the richness of Hispanic culture is also a key objective. As such, campers will be discovering elements such as:

- Fun facts about Christmas traditions in the Spanish speaking world
- Singing Christmas carols in Spanish
- Where Spanish is spoken in the world
- Preparation /cooking of typical food from a Hispanic country
- Music and dance
- Traditional games
- Craft - create Christmas projects that reflect an element of Hispanic culture
